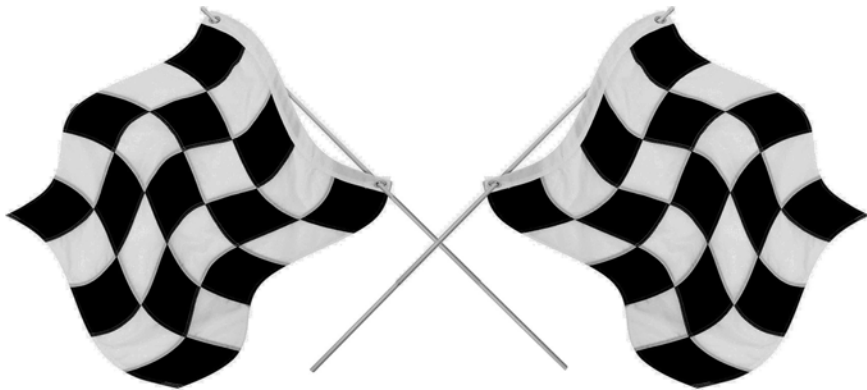

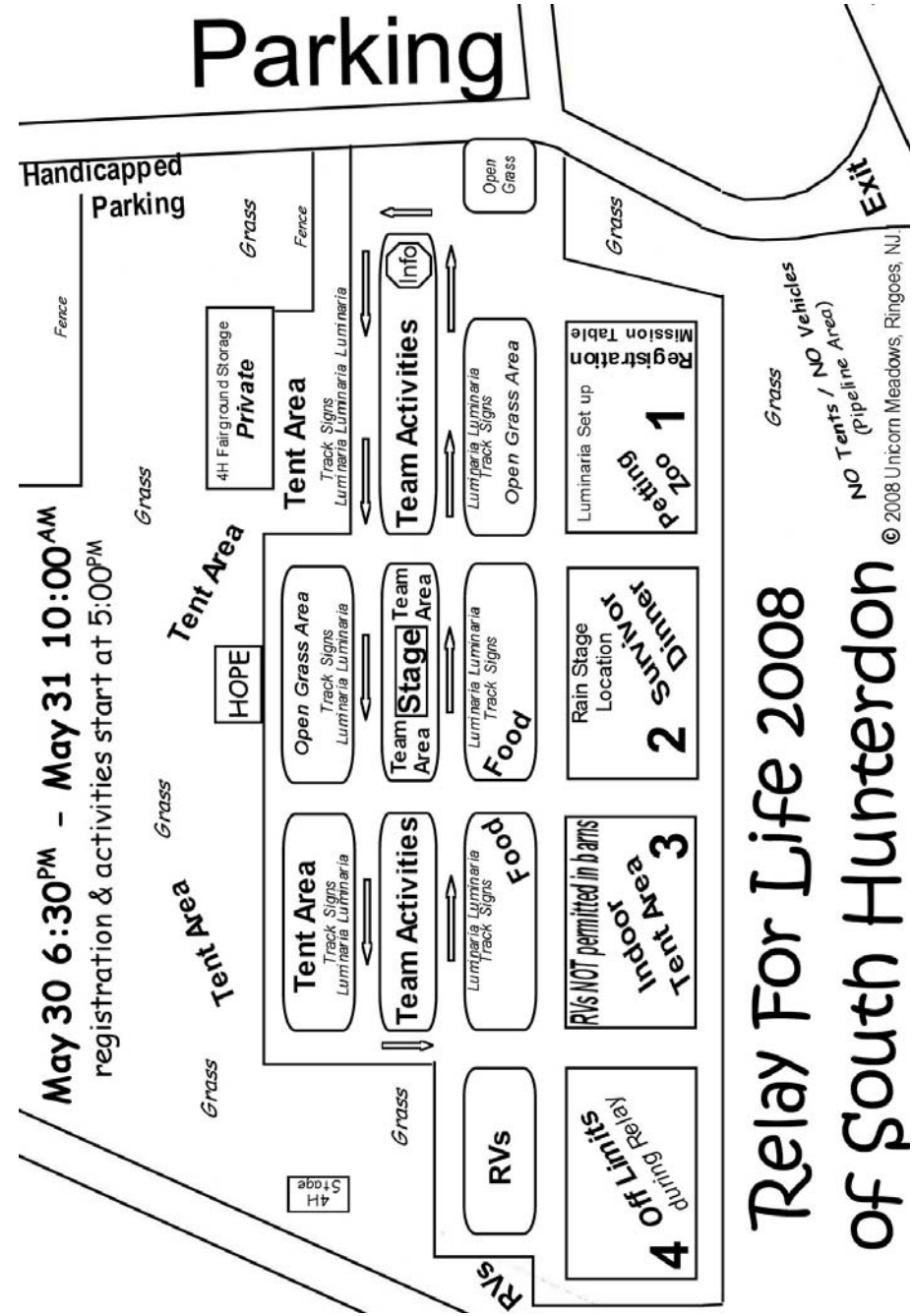

In May 1985, Dr. Gordon Klatt, a colorectal surgeon & avid runner, took the first step of his 24-hour walk/run around a track in Tacoma, Washington. He clocked 83 miles, raising \$27,000 to support the American Cancer Society (ACS). The following year, 220 supporters on 19 teams joined Dr. Klatt in this overnight event, & the ACS Relay For Life[®] was born. Over the last 23 years, the Relay For Life[®] has spread to over 3,800 communities in the United States & eight foreign countries. What began as one man's statement in the fight against cancer has led to the development of a worldwide event to help banish cancer.

All of the money that we raise through our various activities will support the ACS with cancer research, patient services, advocacy, & education. Your support of our event is making a huge difference! At Relay, people from within the community gather to celebrate survivors, remember those lost to cancer, & to fight back against this disease. Relay participants help raise money & awareness to support the American Cancer Society in its lifesaving mission to eliminate cancer as a major health issue. During Relay For Life[®] events, teams of people gather at schools, fairgrounds, or parks & take turns walking or running laps. The events are held overnight to represent the fact that cancer never sleeps.
